

Guidelines for Internationalizing the Increasing Women in Neuroscience Toolkits

Consider the following guidelines when adapting an Increasing Women in Neuroscience toolkit presentation for an audience outside of the United States.

- ☐ Highlight and strengthen the presentation's message by making it more relevant to the local situation. For example, you could:
 - Supplement the provided data with statistics from your country.
 - Highlight the ways in which the local culture may or may not contribute to gender inequity.
 - o Provide examples of bias that reflect the diversity within your community.
- □ Define terms that may not be self-explanatory and replace academic titles, such as assistant professor or associate professor, with familiar terminology.
- ☐ Translate toolkit presentation to primary language if intended audience does not have sufficient mastery of the English language.
